

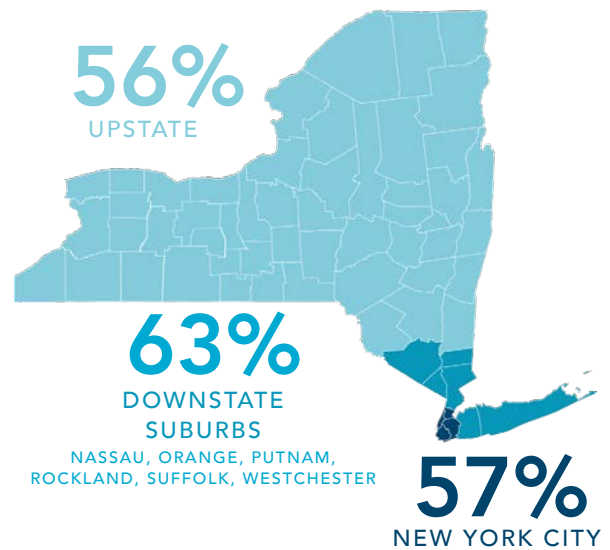

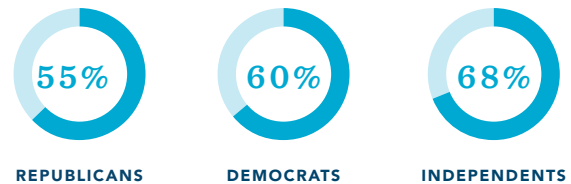
A Marist College poll shows that 59 percent of New York voters support legislation that would allow terminally ill patients to end their own lives if they choose

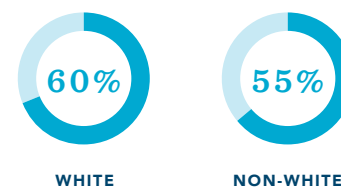
## Support for Medical Aid in Dying is consistent across New York

### RACE

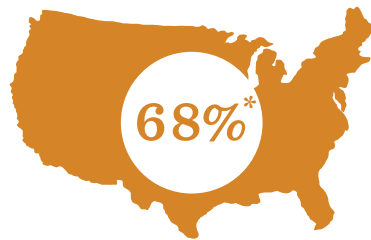

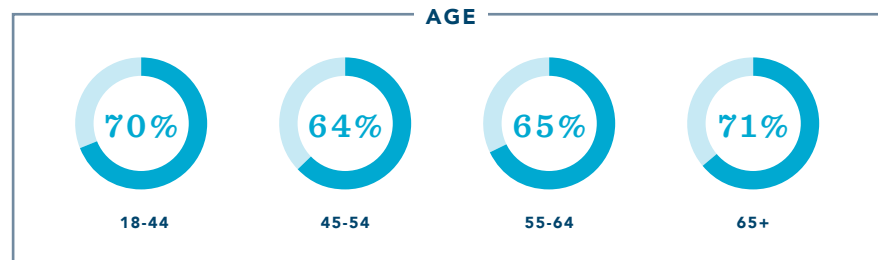
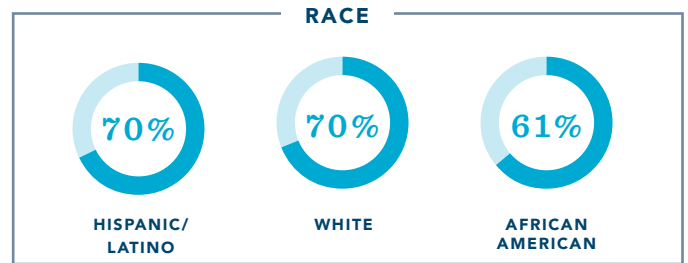
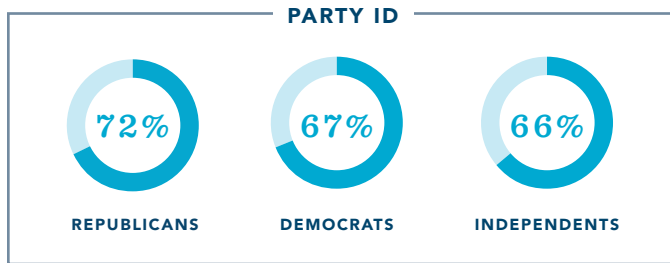


# Support for Medical Aid in Dying is not just growing in New York, but also nationally, with strong support regardless of party, age or race.

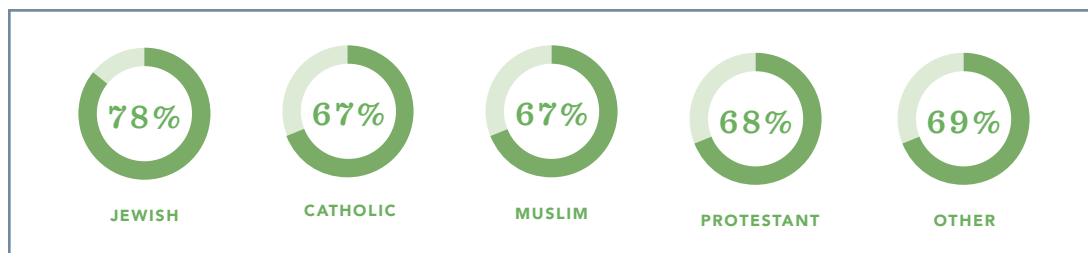
Two-thirds of Americans agree:
