



RETIREE TRANSPORTATION BENEFITS



Retiree parking

As a retiree, you enjoy complimentary parking on a space available basis.

- > **Obtain a daily permit online with your UW NetID, or by showing your retiree credentials at the gatehouse**
 - Retiree identification card alone is not a parking permit
- > **Privilege is non-transferrable**
- > **Is available to fully retired UW retirees and their spouses (one permit per couple)**

Disability Parking

- > **Stop by the gatehouse to get an accessible/disability permit that allows you to park in a disability stall based on availability.**
- > **Specific lots can be requested, but assignment is based on availability at the time of the request.**
- > **UW or State issued disability placard will need to be displayed along with the permit.**

Event Parking

- > If a lot is not specifically reserved for an event, retiree parking is available.
- > If a lot is being used for an event retiree parking is not available.
- > Event parking will be indicated on the Transportation Services website and with a physical sign at the lot.

Returning for reemployment?

> Options

- If you are working part-time (40% FTE or less), you are eligible for a discounted SOV permit, other products available at a discount**
 - If you are working more than 40% FTE, you must pay the same parking rates and follow the same policies as other regular UW employees**
- > Parking before noon on Saturday and after 5 pm on weekdays is complimentary for all UW retirees regardless of the reason.**
- > Parking after noon on Saturday and all-day Sunday is complimentary for all users.**

Online Customer Portal

- > Retirees can obtain a parking permit through the Customer Portal on the UW Transportation Services website: <http://transportation.uw.edu>
- > You can log in and link your vehicle to a daily retiree parking permit
 - This is an alternative to stopping at the gatehouse.
 - Location will be based on availability, as is stopping at a gatehouse to receive a permit
 - Permit will be linked to your vehicle license plate
 - The parking system will recognize your classification as a retiree

UW retirees

Complimentary parking is available to fully retired UW retirees and their spouses at the UW Seattle campus (one permit per couple). This privilege is not transferable to others, including other relatives. Surviving spouses retain parking privileges, but need to obtain a Husky Card.

Retirees may obtain a daily parking permit either [online at the customer portal](#) or by stopping at any campus gatehouse and presenting their UW Retiree Husky Card to one of our parking specialists. **The retiree card alone is not a parking permit.**

PARKING OPTIONS

Regional Reduced Fare Permit by ORCA

Provides senior riders with reduced fares on public transportation

- > **Not run by UW Transportation Services**
- > **Available through ORCA card**
- > **The permit is free to obtain**
- > **Available on Puget Sound transit systems (Metro, Kitsap, Community, Sound Transit, etc.)**
- > **Can be obtained in person or by email**
 - Available at Metro's Customer Service Information Office (King Street Center)
 - ORCA To-Go Mobile Events
 - Other transit agencies
