As a UW retiree, you enjoy complimentary parking on a space available basis at all three campuses.

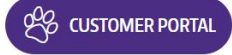

- > **Obtain a parking permit on the day you're coming to campus:**
 - Show your retiree Husky card at a staffed gate, OR
 - Use your Husky netID to reserve online at the customer portal

UW retirees

Complimentary parking is available to fully retired UW retirees and their spouses at the UW Seattle campus (one permit per couple). This privilege is not transferable to others, including other relatives. Surviving spouses retain parking privileges, but need to obtain a Husky Card.

Retirees may obtain a daily parking permit either [online at the customer portal](#) or by stopping at any campus gatehouse and presenting their UW Retiree Husky Card to one of our parking specialists. **The retiree card alone is not a parking permit.**

COMPLIMENTARY PARKING AT UW SEATTLE

- > **Your spouse/partner may use your privilege (one car per household at a time only)**
- > **You may move your car from lot to lot**
- > **If the online tool tells you a lot is full but there is space available, you may park there**

Online Customer Portal

- > Obtain a parking permit through the Customer Portal:
uwts.t2hosted.com/account/portal
- > Choose 'UW Login' and use your netID & password
 - The parking system will recognize that you are a retiree
 - Permit will be linked to your vehicle license plate(s)

Retiree Disability Parking at UW Seattle

- > **Stop by a staffed gatehouse to get an accessible/disability permit that allows you to park in a disability stall based on availability.**
- > **UW or State issued disability placard will need to be displayed along with the permit.**

Retiree Event Parking at UW Seattle

- > See transportation.uw.edu/park/events/calendar for lots with event fees, or look for signs at the lot.
- > If a lot has an event fee, complimentary retiree parking is not available in that lot.

Returning for reemployment?

> Options

- If you are working part-time (40% FTE or less), you are eligible for a discounted SOV permit**
 - If you are working more than 40% FTE, you must pay the same parking rates and follow the same policies as other regular UW employees**
 - When you come to campus for a non-work reason, you may use the free parking privilege**
- > Free retiree parking before noon on Saturday and after 5 pm on weekdays is for all UW retirees regardless of the reason.**
- > Parking after noon on Saturday and all day on Sunday is complimentary for everyone**

Regional Reduced Fare Permit by ORCA

Provides riders over 65 with reduced fares on public transportation

- > **Not run by UW Transportation Services**
- > **The RRFP ORCA permit is free to obtain.**
- > **Metro bus rides and light rail rides using the RRFP ORCA are \$1**
- > **Available on Puget Sound transit systems (Metro buses, Access, water taxi, streetcar, light rail, Monorail, Sound Transit Express, Sounder, etc.)**
- > **Can be obtained in person or by email**
 - Available at Metro's Customer Service Information Office (King Street Center)
 - ORCA To-Go Mobile Events
 - Other transit agencies
